

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SHORT-TERM FINANCING

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump, at a Regular meeting held on the 22nd day of March at 8:00pm determined that the public interest requires short-term financing within the Town of Pahrump, State of Nevada, and the following findings of fact determine this:

1. That the Town of Pahrump is a vital growing community which takes pride in its local government operation.
2. That the Town of Pahrump desires to present its local government as representative of the community and professional in nature.
3. That the Town of Pahrump currently houses its administrative functions in rented office space at continued expense to the taxpayers of the community.
4. That the Town of Pahrump would benefit from the building of a Town Office Complex due to smoother operations, higher morale, and a facility which meets the increasing administrative and staffing needs of our growing community.

WHEREAS, proper notice was given of the intention to act upon the Resolution Authorizing Short-Term Financing pursuant to NRS 354.613 and Nevada Administrative Code 354.550 through 354.620.

Now, therefore, it is hereby RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump proposes to borrow a sum not to exceed \$80,000.00 at an annual interest rate not to exceed 6.45% to be repaid over a period of not more than ten years.

The proposes for which the funds are to be used is:

Payment for construction costs of a new Town Office Complex of approximately 2000 square feet.

The funds will be repaid from the following sources:

Annual revenues associated with the Town of Pahrump general government fund (501). The revenues are derived from Ad Valorem taxes; Supplemental City/County Relief taxes; Intergovernmental Sources including gasoline tax, grants from Nye County, and MVPT; Licenses and Permits; and Fines and Forfeitures.

It is further RESOLVED that the Clerk forward the necessary documents to the Executive Director, Department of Taxation, Carson City, Nevada.

SUBJECT: DECLARATION OF SCENIC HIGHWAY DESIGNATION FOR  
STATE ROUTES 159 & 160 and ROUTE 212

WHEREAS, the unincorporated Town of Pahrump is justifiably proud of its scenic location in southern Nevada, and

WHEREAS, the recently completed Route 212 more commonly known as the Bob Ruud Memorial Highway has linked southern Nevada to Death Valley National Monument, and

WHEREAS, this new highway will provide the shortest access between Death Valley National Monument and the City of Las Vegas through the Town of Pahrump, and

WHEREAS, it is expected that visitors to these areas will avail themselves of this shortest route possible in order to enjoy the unique scenery of this area, and

WHEREAS, these visitors will pass directly through the Town of Pahrump therefor being an economic benefit to the Town of Pahrump,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the unincorporated Town of Pahrump resolves as follows:

That the unincorporated Town of Pahrump hereby requests the appropriate state and local agencies to declare the route consisting of those portions of State Routes 159 and 160 and Route 212 which connect Death Valley National Monument to Las Vegas via Pahrump to be a scenic highway.

Whereas, we in Pahrump benefit daily from the knowledge and skills of these highly trained individuals; and

Whereas, it is appropriate to recognize the value and the accomplishments of emergency medical services providers by designating Emergency Medical Services Week; and

Whereas, the designation of Emergency Medical Services Week will serve to educate the people of the Town of Pahrump about injury prevention and how to respond to a medical emergency; and

Now, therefore, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump in recognition of this event do hereby proclaim the week of May 15-21, 1994, as

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Pahrump Town Clerk shall forward the necessary documents to the Department of Taxation, State of Nevada.

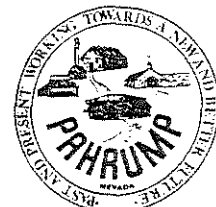
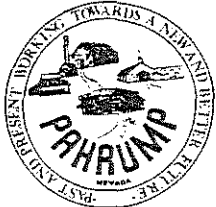

PETITION AND RESOLUTION FOR EXEMPTION

It is resolved by the Board of the Pahrump Swimming Pool District, Nye County, State of Nevada that;

Whereas, the Pahrump Swimming Pool District is in current compliance with the Local Government Budget Act, NRS 354.470 to 354.626, inclusive; and

Whereas the total expenditures for said District for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1994 and 1995 are not anticipated to exceed \$100,000 including debt service;

Therefore, it is resolved that the Pahrump Swimming Pool District Board of said District petition the Nevada Department of Taxation for exemption from the following:

1. Filing a tentative budget for the 1995-1996 fiscal year.
2. Filing an independent audit report for the 1994-1995 fiscal year.
3. Publishing requirements of the Local Government Budget Act, other than the annual publication of a notice of budget adoption and filing.
4. Maintaining accounting records on an accrual or modified accrual basis.

Be it further resolved that if said District is granted the above-referenced exemption, that it will comply with the filing of an annual budget on or before April 15, 1995, the publication of a notice of budget adoption and filing of quarterly budget reports, pursuant to NRS 354.475, as well as the filing of an annual Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balance and a Balance Sheet pursuant to NA 354.010.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE "NATURAL" MAINTENANCE  
OF A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE PAHRUMP CEMETERY GROUNDS

WHEREAS, the Nye County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter "Board") is cognizant that the present day Pahrump Cemetery, which is owned by Nye County, is located in the aboriginal lands of the Southern Paiutes and more specifically, the Pahrump Paiute Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Board is aware that the Pahrump Cemetery is the final resting place of a great number of Southern Paiutes, including two Southern Paiute Chiefs, and that numerous descendants of these Southern Paiutes still reside in the Southern Nevada area; and

WHEREAS, members of the Paiute Tribe continuously have maintained their portion of the Pahrump Cemetery over the years; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been informed that the gravesites of the Southern Paiute, as they are maintained with mounds and natural vegetation, play an integral part in the culture, religion, and traditional beliefs of the Southern Paiute; and

WHEREAS, the Board also has been informed that leveling and/or maintaining the graves of the Southern Paiute with a grass covering would be considered a desecration; and

WHEREAS, the United States has adopted two laws, the American Indian Religious Freedom Act and the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act which, among other things, provide that American Indians should have access to their burial sites and the full right to worship through their traditional ceremonials and traditional rites; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada Legislature also has adopted laws for the protection of Indian burial sites, at NRS 383.150 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, NRS 383.180 makes it a crime for anyone to willfully remove, mutilate, deface, injure or destroy the cairn or grave of a native Indian; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been advised that segregation of the Pahrump Cemetery for the purpose of providing an area exclusively for the burial of the Southern Paiutes would be a violation of the Civil Rights Act of 1866, as a denial of equal utilization of a public facility; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NRS 244.292, the Board has the authority to control and maintain the Pahrump Cemetery as it deems appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of Nye County that the Pahrump Cemetery not be segregated as to access or utilization, but that a portion

thereof continue to be "naturally" maintained, as it has been by the Southern Paiutes,

NOW THEREFORE, it hereby is resolved as follows:

1. A portion of the Pahrump Cemetery, more particularly described as being a portion of Section 14, Township 20 South, Range 53 East, M.D.B.&M., Block 2, Lot 25 of Calvada Unit #6, APN # 3827113, and outlined on the maps attached hereto as Exhibits "A" and "B", shall hereafter be perpetually maintained in the "natural" manner of the Southern Paiutes.

2. All persons, of whatever race, color, religion, or national origin, shall have full access and utilization of the said area described in Paragraph 1, so long as they agree to the maintenance of their graves in the "natural" manner established for that section.
