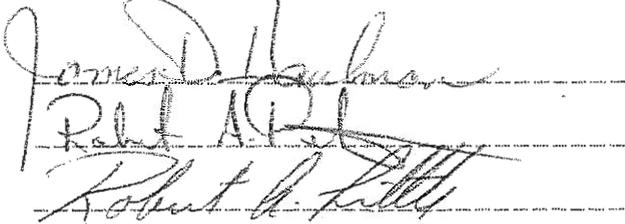

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Town Board requests that the Nye County Auditor/Recorder and the Nye County Treasurer transfer \$105,000.00 from the Pahrump Town General Fund to the Pahrump Town Capital Projects Fund.

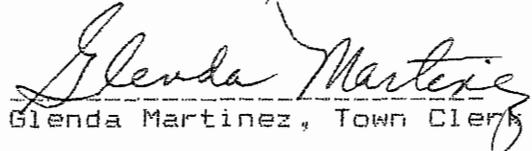

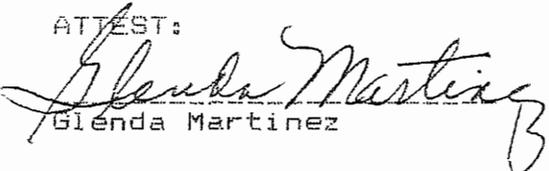

RESOLUTION 92-3

FIRE DEPARTMENT COMMENDATION

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of September, 1992, a major fire occurred at a local Pahrump business known as RAMONA MANUFACTURING, a division of International Consumers at approximately 10:00 P.M. and

WHEREAS, the fire that occurred was of such a magnitude so as to be an extreme danger to property and life, and

WHEREAS, in actuality the fire was the largest fire ever to occur in Nye County, Nevada, and

WHEREAS, the Pahrump Volunteer Fire Department, with a force of 40 men and women and assisted by the Amargosa Valley Volunteer Fire Department, crews from the Bureau of Land Management and volunteers from the Valley Electric Association responded immediately to the threat that said fire represented, and

WHEREAS, the actions of the individual members and volunteers of the Pahrump Volunteer Fire Department and those assisting demonstrated professionalism and adherence to fire fighting procedures which went far and above ordinary and expected efforts, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Pahrump and the residents of the Town of Pahrump are desirous of expressing their gratitude to the Pahrump Volunteer Fire Department and those who assisted it.

PAHRUMP TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION 92-5

TO: NYE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

DATE: NOVEMBER 24, 1992

FROM: URGENT HEALTH CARE SERVICES FOR PAHRUMP CITIZENS

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump has examined a proposal by Cambridge Health System, Inc., a Nevada not-for-profit corporation, a/k/a Spring Valley Hospital to provide medical out-reach services for Pahrump in coordination with the construction of a new hospital in Clark County, Nevada, and

WHEREAS, said proposal includes, among other plans, provisions for 24-hour emergency care, observation beds, chemotherapy and dialysis treatment and a pharmacy, staffed 24 hours a day by physicians and registered nurses, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that these services are critically needed by the residents of the unincorporated Town of Pahrump and are in the best interests of the health and welfare of the residents of Pahrump, and

WHEREAS, as a condition of providing the above services, it is necessary for Cambridge Health System, Inc., to have authorized by the State of Nevada bonds which will be sold to finance the project, and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Pahrump shall not be obligated, in any manner, relating to the sale of said bonds, and

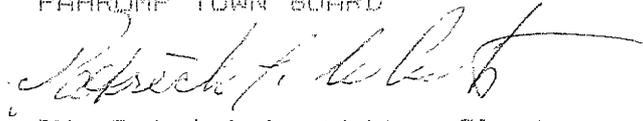
WHEREAS, as a further condition to providing said services, Cambridge Health System, Inc., intends to petition the County Commissioners of Nye County, Nevada, to provide the physical hospital facility to be located within the unincorporated Town of Pahrump and which facility is to be paid for by Nye County, Nevada, and

WHEREAS, Cambridge Health System, Inc., has requested that the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump and Nye County, by and through the County Commissioners endorse its medical out-reach program to the State of Nevada in order to facilitate the authorization of said bonds, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has unanimously agreed that such a plan and proposal will inure to the best health and welfare of the citizens it represents.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of Pahrump endorses and approves the plans for Cambridge Health System, Inc., to provide medical services to the unincorporated Town of Pahrump and urges both the County Commission of the County of Nye and the State of Nevada to support said plan as well as the authorization of bonds and the construction of the facility which will make these plans a reality.
