WHEREAS, the Board would support a large delegation from Pahrump attending committee hearings; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that the proposed education center would benefit the residents of Pahrump and Southern Nye County by providing advanced and comprehensive computer training facilities and classroom space for high school, college and adult students; and

WHEREAS, the Board further believes that the siting in Pahrump of the proposed educational facility would enhance the quality of life in the Pahrump Valley,

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved as follows:

1. The Pahrump Town Board supports the siting in Pahrump of the Community College of Southern Nevada's proposed "Education Center".

2. The Pahrump Town Board urges the Nevada State Legislature to fund the establishment and operating costs of the "Educational Center" and, further, requests the Legislature to support the establishment of that educational facility in Pahrump.

3. The Town Board Clerk forthwith shall forward a copy of this Resolution to each member of the 1997 Nevada State Legislature.

PAHRUMP TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Town of Pahrump has previously enacted a business license ordinance pursuant to the statutory authority designated in NRS 269.170; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada State Tax Commission has previously reviewed and approved the adoption of said local ordinance; and

WHEREAS, it is now the desire of the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump to designate the expenditure of revenues received pursuant to said ordinance for a particular purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with NRS 354.241 the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump does hereby resolve as follows:

1. That a fund be designated for the receipt of all revenues received by the Town of Pahrump pursuant to Pahrump Town Board Ordinance No. 35. That the purpose of this fund is to ensure the orderly management, processing, revue and enforcement of all matters relating to business licenses in the Town of Pahrump.
2. The source of the money to be placed in the fund shall be all revenues derived from PTO No. 35 as aforesated.
3. The fund shall be spent on day to day expenses incurred by the Town of Pahrump in the management, processing, revue and enforcement of business license matters including, but not limited to, printing, postage and labor. In the future, the fund may be used to pay the salary of an individual designated as the ordinance enforcement officer
4. The balance, reserve and retained earnings of this fund shall be used for community development projects and tourism related matters as the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump shall, in their judgement see fit.
5. The Town Board of the Town of Pahrump anticipates no deficiency in the balance, reserve or retained earnings of this fund. However, if a deficiency should occur, this deficiency will be cured by transferring revenue for the contingency fund of the general fund of the Pahrump Town Budget.
6. The fund shall be reviewed by the town's accountant not less than quarterly, who will determine whether the balance, reserve and retained earnings of the fund are

reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of the fund as hereinstated. The town accountant shall report his determinations to the Town Board again, not less than quarterly.

WHERE AS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump desires to have the strongest input possible in the appointment process;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump does hereby resolve as follows:


1. That upon a vacancy occurring on the Pahrump Town Board, for whatever reason, the remaining members of the Board shall select a number of persons, not less than one nor more than three, who in the Board's opinion are the most qualified persons to fill said vacancy.
2. The Town Board of the Town of Pahrump shall endeavor to have the persons so selected endorsed by the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Nye.
3. Upon selection as above stated, the Town Board shall forward these recommendations to the Governor of the State of Nevada urging the Governor to appoint a person to fill said vacancy from the designated selectees.



RESOLUTION NO. 97-5
NEVADA LEAGUE OF CITIES

RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE EXTENT AND QUALITY
OF CITIZEN PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNANCE

WHEREAS, the Nevada League of Cities has strongly supported initiatives to increase the quality and extent of citizen participation in the process of developing public policy and improving the operations of government; and

WHEREAS, the 1997 Nevada Legislature enacted Senate Bill 429, Chapter 236.035 of the 1997 Statutes of Nevada, which, among other sections, empowers any city council or governing body of an incorporated city to " institute a program or sponsor an activity, event or any other action designed to increase the extent and quality of participation of the residents within the incorporated city in the development of public policy and the improvement of the operation of government at all levels;" and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Nevada has issued a Proclamation declaring "Constitution Week" and "Constitution Day" in Nevada and, in connection therewith, has called upon all interested citizens, including persons in the news media, educators, state and local government officers, and business, professional, labor, and civic leaders to develop new programs and recommend new ideas, materials, and actions that can be considered in order to improve the extent and quality of citizen participation in the process of governance; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada League of Cities desires to help the Governor and the Nevada Legislature achieve the goals set forth above and to assist the Director of the Department of Museums, Library, and Arts in adding valuable resource materials to the repository established pursuant to the authority of Senate Concurrent Resolution 38, 1995 Statutes of Nevada, and Senate Bill 429, Chapter 236.035 of the 1997 Statutes of Nevada.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Nevada League of Cities as follows:

1. All members of the Nevada League of Cities are hereby urged to consider and establish appropriate programs, events, activities or other actions to improve the extent and quality of citizen participation on the development of public policy and the improvement of government operations within the jurisdictions of the respective incorporated cities in the State;


2. Whenever a successful program, event, activity, or other action as described above is completed, a report of same shall be deposited in the repository for records concerning programs, activities, and events related to the participation of citizens in the development of public policy and the improvement of operations of government that has been established in the Nevada Department of Museums, Library, and Arts;

3. All members of the Nevada League of Cities are encouraged to plan appropriate events commemorating "Constitution Week" and "Constitution Day" as proclaimed by the Governor of the State of Nevada and to encourage citizens in their jurisdictions to respond with new ideas to increase the extent and quality of citizen participation in governance.

RESOLUTION 97- 6
PAHRUMP TOWN BOARD

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump is cognizant that the present day Pahrump Cemetery, which is managed by the Town of Pahrump, is located in the aboriginal lands of the Southern Paiutes and more specifically, the Pahrump Paiute Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board is aware that the Pahrump Cemetery is the final resting place of a great number of Southern Paiutes, including two Southern Paiute Chiefs, and that numerous descendants of these Southern Paiutes still reside in the Southern Nevada area; and

WHEREAS, members of the Paiute Tribe continuously have maintained their portion of the Pahrump Cemetery over the years; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has been informed that the grave sites of the Southern Paiute, as they are maintained with mounds and natural vegetation, play an integral part in the culture, religion, and traditional beliefs of the Southern Paiutes; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has also been informed that leveling and/or maintaining the graves of the Southern Paiute with a grass covering would be considered a desecration; and

WHEREAS, the United States has adopted two laws, the American Indian Religious Freedom Act and the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act which, among other things, provide that American Indians should have access to their burial sites and the full right to worship through their traditional ceremonials and traditional rites; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada Legislature also has adopted laws for the protection of Indian burial sites, at NRS 383.150, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has the authority to control and maintain the Pahrump Cemetery as it deems appropriate; and

WHEREAS, Pahrump Town Ordinance No. 39 specifically provides for the dedication of a portion of the Pahrump Cemetery to the Pahrump Paiute Tribe at PTO 39.300(B)(3);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump does hereby resolve as follows:



That the Town of Pahrump be and hereby does adopt all the terms, conditions and proposals as set forth in Nye County Resolution No. 94-28 entitled "Resolution providing for the "Natural" maintenance of a certain portion of the Pahrump Cemetery Grounds which Resolution is attached to this Resolution by reference and is incorporated herein.

OPEN LETTER

TO: NYE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

FROM: TOWN BOARD MEMBERS OF THE UNINCORPORATED
TOWN OF PAHRUMP

Gentlemen:

We are sure that you are aware of our recent and intense discussions regarding the composition of the Nye County Commission. We are further sure that you are familiar with the unprecedented population growth here in the Pahrump valley. Demographically, we of the Town Board are convinced to a certainty, that the population of the Pahrump valley now easily exceeds sixty percent (60%) of the total population of Nye County.

We have debated publically the pros, cons and desirability of bringing legal action to have Nye County redistricted and/or reapportioned. We feel in our hearts that spending taxpayer money to procure a right that is so inherent to the public is both repugnant and a waste of taxpayer assets. We are, therefore, taking this one last opportunity to speak to you directly as public servants to public servants. For this is the heart of this controversy — public service.

We have watched with interest while members of your board have confronted the federal government with constitution in hand, professing publically to be the jealous guardians of the public's "constitutional rights". What greater constitutional right is inherent to the public than equal, fair and proportional representation? How can you, in good faith, profess to preserve the constitutional rights of that percentage of the population of the Pahrump valley which is currently unrepresented at the County Commission?

We challenge you now to serve the public as is both your duty and your responsibility. Over 200 years ago this nation emerged from the simple issue of taxation without representation. Our representative form of government was constructed and designed to see to it that never again would citizens be liable to a government in which they had no say. Now, as then, we expect that those elected to serve the public will make the moral, ethical and, often times, difficult decision to exercise their duties and responsibilities as public servants.







RESOLUTION TO AUGMENT THE 1997-98 BUDGET OF PAHRUMP TOWN.

Whereas, the opening fund balance and revenues of the General Fund (no. 501) of Pahrump Town were budgeted to be \$ 1,638,140 on July 1, 1997 and whereas the opening fund balance and revenues are now determined to be \$ 1,739,317.

Whereas, the budget for the Fire Department Capital Outlay in the 1996-97 year included the purchase of fire equipment of approximately \$ 74,600 that can not be delivered until after June 30, 1997. The Board requested approval from the Department of Taxation for this augmentation and the approval is attached as part of this resolution.

Whereas, the Town Board may increase expenditures in the Town Board capital outlay account by augmenting the budget for an amount not to exceed 1/12 of the actual 1996-97 expenditures without Department of Taxation approval.

The decrease in the business license fee revenues and expenditures is due to the creation of a new fund to account for the receipt and expenditures of the business license fees.

Now, therefore, it is resolved, that the Town of Pahrump shall augment the fiscal year 1997-98 budget by appropriating \$ 151,177 for use in the General Fund (no.501) thereby increasing its appropriations from \$ 1,469,841 to \$ 1,621,018.


The increase in budget of the Town Fire Department of \$ 74,600 has been approved by the Department of Taxation.

1. That a fund be designated "Cemetery Fund" for the receipt of all revenues received by the Town of Pahrump from any and all activities at the Pahrump Cemetery. That the purpose of this fund is to ensure the orderly management, upkeep, planning and development of all matters relating to the cemetery in the Town of Pahrump.
2. The source of the money to be placed in the fund shall be all revenues derived from activities in the Pahrump Town Cemetery as aforesated.
3. The fund shall be spent on day to day expenses incurred by the Town of Pahrump in the management, upkeep, planning and development, including labor, of the Pahrump Town Cemetery.
4. The balance, reserve and retained earnings of this fund shall be placed in the general fund of the unincorporated Town of Pahrump and used as the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump shall, in their judgement see fit.
5. The Town Board of the Town of Pahrump anticipates no deficiency in the balance, reserve or retained earnings of this fund. However, if a deficiency should occur, this deficiency will be cured by transferring revenue from the contingency fund of the general fund of the Pahrump Town Budget.
6. The fund shall be reviewed by the town's accountant not less than quarterly, who will determine whether the balance, reserve and retained earnings of the fund are reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of the fund as herein stated. The town accountant shall report his determinations to the Town Board again, not less than quarterly.
